

Sydney Food company relocates to West Gosford Dec 6th

Sydney Company “Food to Nourish” has relocated to West Gosford with the support of a Regional Growth loan from the NSW Government’s Jobs for NSW program. The official opening of the site took place on the 6th December.

Six years ago, nutritionist and Co-founder Danielle Minnebo identified a gap in the market for genuinely healthy gluten free foods and in 2013 together with Natasha Jirwander, packaging designer, founded “Food to Nourish”

The company started out as a kitchen business. It then relocated to a 200sqm facility on the Northern Beaches in Sydney. The site was outgrown and restricting its capacity and the decision was taken with the help of Jobs for NSW to establish and open a new 600 square metre at West Gosford.

Food to Nourish manage every aspect of their product creation; from the minute the raw bulk ingredients arrive, to the point they leave sealed and packaged as tasty products.

The facility is certified organic with NASAA, ensuring their processes and manufacturing standards adhere to strict organic guidelines. The production facilities are also HACCP certified.

They manufacture a range of spreads, snacks, cake, muffin and bread mixes, cereals, packaged nuts and seeds.

It currently has 35 products stocked in more than 600 stores. Mrs Minnebo said the new facility will allow her to increase production capacity by up to 40 per cent in the first year alone and focus on overseas expansion. Ten staff have been hired and it is planned to grow this number to over thirty by 2022.

The facility was opened by the Parliamentary Secretary for the Central Coast Scot MacDonald MLC and Jobs for NSW CEO, Nicole Cook.
